Tomorrow. . . Bryce! Time to start getting serious. . . no more boredom!!!








All you have to do is keep an eye on where your feet are and where you step.



Here is our new base of operations for the next two weeks. . .




We even have nice live yard art. . . an 8-point mule deer buck and a doe about 10 feet from our front door. . .

We finally had to give up due to the persistent and increasing rain.




We did make it up to the East entrance. . . what a day makes for the view of Checkerboard Mesa. . .

place. We started out just exploring, not knowing exactly how muddy it was going to be. We ended up in one of our favorite places. . . and it wasn't that muddy at all. . .




All you need to do is add a camera. . . or two.







Here are some selected snapshots from the past few days. . . not in any particular order. . . some are in the rain, some with cloudy conditions, some out in the sun. . .


The sun was in and out yesterday morning and light rain was off and on, but the view was nice. . .



Late in the day and Susan is ready to hike out. I had one more exposure and we called it a day, just in time to make it back to the room and get settled in before dark.




This morning we headed back to a previously selected place so Susan could catch an 8x20



Today we have a storm moving in and it was cloudy all afternoon. . . the light is amazing!




In deep shadow you have to time long exposures. . . we have been lucky in that the wind has not been a factor the last few days.

The penguins didn't seem to mind the weather. . .





This was a good day to catch up on the housekeeping chores. Yes. . . that means reloading film holders. First a lot of 4x10's. . .


Sent: Friday, December 26, 2014 9:46 PM Subject: From The Road 12-26-2014

The wind was still a factor today, so we decided to head to our usual last day in the park hike. This is an easy trail, not steep, but a long hike into a really interesting area. It is a deep canyon and offers protection from the annoying wind.

Here is the trailhead. . . the really neat stuff is way back there. Fortunately, few people know of this one, or just don't bother. We saw one person once we left sight of the road all day.



The light in this canyon is amazing all day. You are down in a deep canyon with towering cliffs 1,000-1,200 feet above you. Since the canyon runs East/West this light reflects from the walls above all day.



There are some really strange and amazingly twisted trees and eroded rock in this area. . .






You just have to hike yourself and that gear back into the deeper areas of the trail. . .


Nice to be able to cruise on the Interstates in Utah!


Subject: From The Road 12-28-2014





at the Moab Airport at 3:25pm and they say 25F, wind N 15, gusting to 20mph. . . Feels Like 14.



This is really neat. . . here is where they cut the road through what is known as the Moab Fault.










How about a few snapshots through the windshield?

It has been a busy or bust adventure the last few days here in Moab. Tuesday and Wednesday was a complete wash for photography. It was very cold, in the mid 20's both days, but the killer was the wind. . . steady at 10 and gusting to 25 both days. Impossible to work in, so we took the time to just kick back and do a little sight seeing. We did visit Arches NP both days, but the conditions were just unworkable.

Yesterday was a different story. It was still cold. . . mid 20's to low 30's and for the most part, absolutely no wind!!! We got in a whole day of lugging cameras and exposing film. Spent the entire day at one pullout, working in a new area just below the large rock formation known as "The

Organ." This is one of those 1,200' tall monoliths that stands near the entrance to the park. JB made the difficult climb to the base of the structure to do some details of the interesting rock formation at the base of the monolith. It was a full day in this one place.

It looks like we will be adding one more day to our stay in Moab. The weather here has cleared, but conditions between here and home are not looking favorable. They are calling for inches of snow across New Mexico into the Texas Panhandle, then ice eastward from there into North Texas and home. We will sit it out here one more day to allow this storm system to move on to the east. Oh, the sacrifices one must make!!!







We did return home and this week has been little more than a blur. The gear is stacked in the living room awaiting a quick cleanup and being put away. Some of the clothes are put away. Susan did most of the laundry in Moab before we left, so there is little to do there. We will now begin to work on our film notes, which is the first step before film processing starts. JB is already hauling distilled water, and if things go as usual, film processing should start in 2-3 weeks. . . you never get in a rush to process film!

Then we will begin to sort through what we have and the process of printing will begin. This usually takes 2-3 additional months, since we never get in any rush. It takes time to think things through. . . it is a very intense process of creativity and may take some time for an image to mature. . . some photographs take years to ripen, mature and stabilize into the finished image.
